PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM for TEACHERS of AMERICAN HISTORY in SMALL, RESTRUCTURED DISTRICT 11 MIDDLE SCHOOLS

“Telling America's Story: Traditional American History for Small, Restructured Schools” is a Teaching American History (TAH) Federal Grant designed to improve content knowledge and pedagogical skills of teachers at new, small, restructured **Middle Schools** (7th and 8th grades). **Teachers and/or supervisors** of Social Studies (General or Special Education) are eligible. Approximately twenty (20) teachers per year will participate in an intensive two-week professional development program (Summer Institute) featuring Professor Kenneth T. Jackson of Columbia University, leading NY City Museum Educators and DOE Social Studies professional development experts.

POSITION: TAH grant **Teacher-Historian** in participating small, new or restructured District 11 IS/JHS.

LOCATION: School in which presently employed; Summer Institute at Museum of City of NY, and various museums and historical venues in Manhattan and the Bronx.

HOURS: July 21, 2008 to June 30, 2009
Summer Institute (**7/21/08-8/1/08**: Mon-Fri, 8:30am-3:30pm, conflicts with summer school); some after school/weekend meetings/lectures.

SALARY: As per UFT Collective Bargaining agreement (per session)

ELIGIBILITY: NYC licensed teacher in small, restructured District 11 IS/JHS who is currently teaching or supervising: 7th or 8th grade, U.S. History or equivalent Humanities class(es), or **who will be** teaching or supervising such class(es) in the 2008/2009 academic year.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

1. Evidence of or interest in developing good pedagogical skills and sound U.S. History knowledge.
2. Preference will be given to applicants from low-performing schools (schools not making its AYP or in Title I SINI status).
3. Previous TAH Grant participants are welcome to apply, but preference will be given to new applicants.
4. Evidence of sound interpersonal relationships with colleagues and/or professional development experience.
5. Ability to communicate (written and oral) effectively.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Participate in all after school, summer and Saturday professional development activities.
2. Develop and disseminate program materials and improve content knowledge and pedagogic skills among school colleagues.
3. Submit required group and/or individual curriculum project.
