

## Evacuation Day.

The First Division of the Militia will parade on Monday, the 26th day of November, inst., to commemorate the Evacuation of New-York, by the British army, in 1783, and the restoration of our ancestors to their homes and firesides. The Division line will be formed on the south side of Fourteenth-street, with the right on the Fourth-avenue, at 11 o'clock A. M. The review will take place at 11¼ o'clock.

Fourteenth-street is designated as the parade-ground of the Division, from 11 o'clock A. M. until the Division is marched off the ground after the review. The honors of a marching salute will be paid to the Mayor and Corporation in front of the City Hall, at 1 o'clock P. M. Brigadier-General SPICER will detail a detachment of artillery to fire a National salute from the Battery at 12 o'clock at noon.

The line of march will be down Broadway to Chambers-street, and through Chambers-street and Centre-street to the east gate of the Park.
