

### Murdered by an Italian.

NEW-HAVEN, Conn., July 3.—A characteristic Italian murder was committed here this afternoon about 4:30 o'clock. Several young men of Irish parentage were standing at the corner of Grand Avenue and Wallace Street when two Italians approached. The crowd standing on the corner addressed insulting remarks to them as they passed, whereupon one of the Italians drew a knife from his belt and slashed savagely at the nearest bystander, who received the blow in the abdomen. The victim started to walk off, but dropped after taking a few steps, and expired almost without a groan.

He was Thomas Corcoran, nineteen years old and unmarried. He was a quiet young man, and had taken no part whatever in the insulting remarks addressed to the Italians.

The murderer escaped, and the police are endeavoring vainly to gain a clue to his whereabouts. Five Italians have been arrested on suspicion, but all have been released.
